HELD AT JAWAHARLAL NEHRU CUSTOM HOUSE ON 30.08.2021**

The P.T.F.C. meeting was held through video conference on 30.08.2021 was chaired by Shri U. Niranjan, Pr. Commissioner of Customs (NS-I), Shri Ishtikar Baig, Commissioner of Customs (General & NS-Audit) and Shri N. V. Kulkarni, Commissioner of Customs (NS-II & NS- III) and Shri D.S. Garbyal, Commissioner of Customs (NS-V).

3) Shri Shushil Chandra, Additional Commissioner of Customs, JNCH, started the discussion on the agenda points of the meeting related to the Export.

(I) Agenda points proposed by Brihanmumbai Customs Brokers Association - (BCBA)

(1) Updation of Stuffing reports in Customs EDI System :

The process of updating of 'stuffing reports' in the custom EDI system needs to be streamlined across the various CFS's. We would like to bring to your kind notice that unless the EDI System is updated with requisite information, the Shipping Bill will not move ahead for disbursement of Drawback, IGST and other benefits.

Reply: This matter is being taken with Commissioner (General). They will resolve this matter in coordination with CFS and DG System.

(2) Touch Screen KIOSK to be installed in CPP for tracking of Shipping Bills.

We would like bring to you kind attention that currently there is no facility to check the status of Shipping Bills in the Centralised Parking Plaza. You are kindly requested to provide and install a new KIOSK system at CPP so that trade can take advantage of this facility and can easily get the status of the Shipping Bills.

Reply: The matter will be resolved by EDI at the earliest.

(3) First time importers / exporters, verification of documents

We refer to PN No. 112/2017. It has been brought to the notice of Association that if any importer submits document for first time, documents are again being insisted

at the time Exporter to please put up previous SB Number. This creates confusion at the time of LEO. We request you to please issue advisory accordingly.

Reply : The Chair stated that we will examine this issue, and take it on priority.

(4) Difficulties faced by Exim trade due to lack of infrastructure at CWC Impex Park CFS

The endeavour of Govt. of India is to ensure timely clearance of import export cargo so that our country's rank in Ease of doing business improves. However, the present working and state of condition of CWC Impex Park CFS is contrary to the said endeavour.

- Lack of handling equipment's such as forklift and manpower for loading of cargo is delaying the clearance considerably.
- Vehicle Parking slots are also not available at CWC Impex Park CFS and neither outside the CFS Which causes heavy congestion and difficulties to the EXIM Trade.

We request your intervention to instruct CWC Impex Park CFS Authorities to immediately augment their manpower situation. There is no senior position in CWC Impex Park CFS available to monitor the performance of Fork Lift operators and loaders.

Reply : The Chair proposed meeting with CFS Impex Park with EXIM Trade to sort out the issue.

(II) Agenda points proposed by Container Shipping Lines Association (India) - (CSLA)

- 1) Approx 800 longstanding containers pending for adjudication should be fast tracked in line of HMS containers which have been cleared recently with one month of time only.**

At the last PTFC meeting held on the 29th July, CSLA had highlighted that there were approx. 7000 longstanding containers at Nhava Sheva Port. Out of these approx. 800 containers were pending for adjudication with various group officers of JNCH. Recently JNCH had fast tracked HMS containers which were cleared with one month itself. In the current situation where a shortage of containers existed for exports, a similar drive should be initiated in the case of approx. 800 longstanding containers pending for adjudication & in other cases too, which will help in getting these boxes released for exports.

Commissioner very kindly assured that the release of these 800 containers pending for adjudication would be expedited. He directed the Joint Commissioner to check all these cases and expedite clearance of these long standing case on priority basis. An update on the same would be deeply appreciated.

Reply:- The matter is already discussed.

(2) SCMT Message filing issues.

At the last PTFC meeting, the Commissioner, Mr. Narendra Kulkarni was kind enough to request CSLA to share the SCMT filing issues with him. He promised to take up all SCMT issues with DG System/CBIC and try to arrange resolution. SCLA shared the details over the email with the Commissioner Export & Commissioner General on the 30th July. Any updates on this would be deeply appreciated.

Reply : The matter pertains with DG System and will communicate with DG System.

(III) Agenda points proposed by Container Freight Stations Associations of India (CFSAI)

(1)Expediting the decision of Hold containers withheld by various Investigating Agencies- CFSAI had submitted fresh list of 1678 containers (2227TEUS) vide email dated 11th August, 2021 that are put on hold various investigating agencies CIU, Court Case, Custom Hold, Docks, DRI, MPIU, NSPU, R&I, Police & SIIB. The list is summarized as below for your easy reference:-

Reply: Already discussed on this point.

(2) Long standing uncleared/unclaimed goods pending for Adjudication at Appraising Group.

CFSAI had submitted fresh list of 668 containers that are pending for Adjudication vide email dated 4th August 2021. Our submission requesting to give required directions to officers at various Groups in expediting the adjudication process and speedy disposal of longstanding Cargo.

REPLY :- The matter is already discussed.

(3)MPCB NOC required for Incineration at Waste Management facility Taloja :-

CFSAI had taken this issue in the last PTFC Meeting where compiled list of 73 containers of Member CFSs are still awaiting NOC from MPCB for carrying out Incineration Process. On account Perishable cargo loses their shelf and gets deteriorated which leads to destruction of such cargo and also the cargo loses its commercial value. Our submission requesting MPCB issue NOC before the cargo loses its shelf life and commercial value which will help. Member CFSs in expeditious disposal of such longstanding cargo.

Reply : The Chair stated that they will try to get NOC from MPCB.

(4) Guidelines for retaining/storing Custom Documents :-

We refer to Custom Notification 45/2018 dated 24th May 2018 wherein under Para 18 dated 24th May 2018 wherein under Para 3(1) states that the Custodian need to retain the custom documents for minimum period of 5 years in relation to imported goods or export goods or dutiable goods. As on date there is no such Guidelines / PN from Customs and request to kindly issue Guidelines that shall assist our Members in storing the documents.

Reply : Everybody aware that documents are stored for the minimum 5 years. This does not required any P.N. on the issue. Point may be closed.

(5) Awaiting Guideline on disposal of Export Longstanding goods lying in various CFSs for a long period :-

CFSAI had taken up this issue in last PTFC and several PTFC where as on date our Members CFSs are still awaiting Guidelines/PN on disposal of longstanding export cargo which are unclaimed/uncleared lying in CFSs for years. CFSAI had compiled list of 671 consignments as attached. Our submission once again requesting to issue necessary guidelines which will assist our Member CFSs in expeditious release of such containers to the Shipping Lines and the space released could be used for other import/export general containers.

Reply : The matter is already discussed.

(6) SCMTR Export Cycle – Non Receipt of Messages from Terminals :-

On this issue CFSAI had approached Customs and subsequently this was taken up the Terminals vide email 28th July 2021. However, as on date Our Members are still yet to receive the AT Messages from the Terminals. Request JNCH to take up with the Terminal to completed the export cycle process in SCMTR.

Reply : Dropped the point. If it is needed they will presenting this in next meeting.
